2003 Compliance Reminder

January 2003

**February 1:** The new OSHA 300A Forms (injuries and illnesses) must be posted through April 30.

**March 1:** EPA Section 312 (Tier II) reports are due. Facilities that store 10,000 lbs. or more of any hazardous chemical on-site at any one time or threshold planning quantities of Extremely Hazardous Substances must file. Some states have lower reporting thresholds – if you'd like us to check what your state requirements are, please call.

Some states require Annual Hazardous Waste Reports to be filed by this date as well.

**July 1:** EPA Section 313 (Form R) reports are due.

**Some Annual Training Requirements for Safety Meetings:** Hearing Conservation (and annual audiograms); Fire Extinguisher Training; Review of Lockout Procedures and/or Electrical Safety; Employee Rights to Exposure and Medical Records Review; Annual Respirator Fit Testing; HAZWOPER Emergency Responder Training; EPA Hazardous Waste Handlers Training.

Walking Working Surfaces – reopening record. 12/02?

NESHAP: Plastic Parts and Products (Surface Coating). 8/03.  
TRI: Review of Chemicals on Original List. 12/03.  
TRI: Conversion of SIC Reporting Requirements to NAICS. 9/03.  
Hazardous Waste Manifest Regulation – standardization and electronic processing. 12/03.
